Online Safety and VPN Use

- We have become aware of an increasing number of students attempting to bypass the school's Acceptable Use Policy for IT by installing VPNs on their devices. This allows them to access unapproved websites and applications, including online chat platforms such as OmeTV and Omegle.
- These platforms enable students to video chat with strangers in unmoderated environments that frequently contain sexually explicit content. They also place young people at significant risk of online grooming and exploitation.
- We ask all parents and carers to please be vigilant in monitoring your child's device use at home and to speak with them about the serious risks associated with these platforms. The school will continue to monitor and enforce our Acceptable Use Policy to ensure a safe online environment for all students.

Year 12 VTAC Applications

VTAC stands for The Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre and is the shared admissions service that facilitates access to tertiary education and further study opportunities in Victoria. VTAC receive and process applications for admission into Victorian universities, TAFEs and private colleges. VTAC also calculates the ATAR, and supports students with equity schemes and scholarships.

Applications by students are currently underway and a fee payment of \$80 is due by Friday 28th August to allow students to enter courses and preferences.
