• PAT Testing Semester 2

• All students in Years 7–10 will complete PAT Testing for Reading and Maths this semester. These tests are extremely important as they help staff measure each student's growth over the past 12 months, understand their learning profile, and inform curriculum planning. Students have also discussed their previous PAT results with staff and identified strategies to help them improve their performance this year.

Junior and Middle School (Years 7-10) Preparing Year 10s for VCE/VCE VM

During Term 4 students in Year 10 will not be placed in buddy classes as part of the classroom management process. This process aligns with the process for Year 11&12 students and helps students prepare for their future studies. If a student is unable to correct their behaviour after receiving a warning and being relocated in the classroom they will instead be expected to go home for the day.

Junior Summer Sports

It was fantastic to see over 90 Year 7&8 students out competing in the Junior Summer Sports events last Wednesday. The students represented the school in such a positive manner. Other important information / reminders

Calculators

If your child needs a calculator for next year, instructions for how to purchase our recommended calculators for years 7 - 12 via this link.

For years 7 – 10, you only need to purchase the TI-30X (Bundle 3) calculator. This is an investment that has all required functions to last them for the rest of their high school years.

For years 11 – 12, you need a TI-Nspire (Bundles 1 and 2) for VCE General Maths and VCE Maths Methods. You also need a scientific calculator (Bundle 3) for VCE General Maths, VCE Maths Methods, VCE Chemistry, VCE Physics, and VCE Environmental Science.

Please note that for 7 – 12 students, if your child already has a working scientific calculator, they do not need to purchase a new one.

If you have any questions, please reach out to your child's Maths teacher or Miss Sergent. For all other required equipment for 2026, please refer to your booklist.

Sunsmart for Term4

It's been great to see so many students wearing hats in the yard during the first few weeks of Term.
