# SCHOOL PROFILE STATEMENT

At Cobram Secondary College we support the right of all members of the school community to access safe and inclusive learning environments, including digital and online spaces. This form outlines the School's roles and responsibilities in supporting safe digital learning, as well as the expected behaviours we have of our students when using digital or online spaces.

#### At our School we:

- Have a Student Engagement Policy that outlines our School's values and expected standards of student conduct, including consequences for breaching the standards. This Policy extends to online conduct;
- Have programs in place to educate our students to be safe and responsible users of digital technologies
- Provide information about digital access issues such as online privacy, intellectual property and copyright;
- Supervise and support students using digital technologies for school-directed learning;
- Use clear protocols and procedures to protect students working in online spaces. This includes reviewing the safety and appropriateness of online tools and communities, removing offensive content at earliest opportunity, and other measures;

- Provide a filtered internet service to block inappropriate content. We acknowledge, however, that full protection from inappropriate content cannot be guaranteed
- Use online sites and digital tools that support students' learning;
- Address issues or incidents that have the potential to impact on the wellbeing of our students;
- Refer suspected illegal online acts to the relevant Law Enforcement authority for investigation;

### **EQUITY OF ACCESS**

The Cobram Secondary College BYOD program is compliant with the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development's (DEECD) policies of:

Students not participating in the BYOD program will have access to a school provided netbook on a first come first served basis. Students will be able to borrow at the start of Period 1, Period 3 and Period 5 and must be returned after the end of the double class (ie recess, lunch, end of day)

# **TECHNICAL SUPPORT & REPAIR**

Cobram Secondary College technicians will provide support related to school infrastructure connectivity, including network access, Internet access and connections to printers

Cobram Secondary College technicians are able to provide advice related to hardware and software faults with BYOD devices. Repair of devices is to be sourced by the user through their warranty/insurance agreement or through parties external to the school at cost to the user

# • Insurance and Warranty – BYOD (Cobram Secondary College is not responsible)

- o Maintenance and cost of repairs under warranty is solely the parent/guardian's responsibility
- o The College is not liable in any case if the laptop/tablet is damaged or stolen whilst at school
- o Parents concerned with the potential costs for repair and replacement of BYOD devices should consider options of insurance (not provided by Cobram Secondary College)

# • Repair - School Borrowed Netbooks

- o Students who damage school borrowed netbooks are liable for the cost of repair
- o Repair cost will be determined by current cost of replacement parts
- Issues with school borrowed netbooks not relating to damage will be rectified and netbook returned to student ASAP

# STANDARDS FOR LAPTOP/TABLET CARE

The student is responsible for:

- Adhering to the conditions of the Acceptable Use Agreement
- Backing up their data securely to an external drive or cloud storage facility (such as Google Drive)
- Maintaining their laptop/tablet in a clean and hygienic manner

Ensuring best efforts are made to keep their devices secured by using a lock for their locker

#### STUDENT DECLARATION

When I use digital technologies and the internet, I agree to be a safe, responsible and ethical user at all times by:

- o Respecting others and communicating with them in a supportive manner;
- Never participating in online bullying (e.g. forwarding messages and supporting others in harmful, inappropriate or hurtful online behaviours);
- Protecting my privacy by not giving out personal details, including my full name, telephone number, address, passwords and images;
- o Protecting the privacy of others by never posting or forwarding their personal details or images without their consent:
- Only taking and sharing photographs or sound or video recordings when others are aware the recording is taking place and have provided their explicit consent as part of an approved lesson;
- o Talking to a teacher or a trusted adult if I personally feel uncomfortable or unsafe online, or if I see others participating in unsafe, inappropriate or hurtful online behavior;
- o Thinking carefully about the content I upload or post online, knowing that this is a personal reflection of who I am and can influence what people think of me;
- Protecting the privacy and security of my school community by not sharing or posting the link to a video conferencing meeting with others, offline in public communications or online on public websites or social media forums;
- Reviewing the terms and conditions of use for any digital or online tool (e.g. age restrictions, parental
  consent requirements), and if my understanding is unclear seeking further explanation from a trusted
  adult:
- Meeting the stated terms and conditions for any digital or online tool, and completing the required registration processes;
- o Handling ICT devices with care and notifying a teacher of any damage or attention required;
- Abiding by copyright and intellectual property regulations by requesting permission to use images, text, audio and video, and attributing references appropriately;
- Not accessing media that falls outside the School's policies;
- Not downloading unauthorised programs, including games;
- o Not interfering with network systems and security or the data of another user;
- Not attempting to log into the network or online service with a username or password of another person.
